## Spotlight on Bonnie Whitmire

Bonnie Whitmire, one of our newest board members, was born in Philadelphia, PA and at age 15 moved with her family to Greenville, SC. Her dad was in the textile business.

She graduated from Clemson University with an undergraduate degree in Spanish and later a Master's degree in English.



Bonnie met her husband Jerry at Clemson where he taught Spanish. Most of her teaching career was spent at the local high school in Clemson where she taught Spanish and English.

Her last several years before retirement included teaching drama and directing the school plays. Some of her favorite plays were *Dearly Departed*, *The Curious Savage*, Kurt Vonnegut's *Welcome to the Monkey House*, and *Screwtape*, which is the stage version of C. S. Lewis's novel *The Screwtape Letters*.

Her two sons were active in the Clemson Area Youth Theater which is where Bonnie first became involved in community theater. She directed her sons when they were in their high school plays.

Bonnie was a member of the Clemson Little Theatre Board of Directors until she and Jerry sold their 45-acre Christmas tree farm and moved to Pittsboro, NC. They moved to Brevard in May 2012 after finding their dream house here in the mountains

Jerry and Bonnie have always loved this area. Other than just being in the mountains, they appreciate having Jerry's family and friends nearby. Their common interests are hiking and gardening, and traveling to Capestrano, Italy each year to visit Bonnie's family and friends.

Bonnie began volunteering with BLT soon after arriving in Brevard and worked on *The Dinner Party* in 2012. This year Bonnie is directing *Blithe Spirit* which opens on April 11<sup>th</sup>.

## *Blithe Spirit* Coming in April

*Blithe Spirit* is a comedy by the British playwright Noel Coward written in 1941 during World War II. Britain was suffering severe casualties from the German bombings, and Noel Coward thought British audiences would appreciate an escapist comedy.

The play concerns the socialite and novelist Charles Condomine, who wants material on the occult for his next book. He invites an eccentric medium, Madame Arcati, to his house to conduct a séance, but his plan backfires when the ghost of his first wife Elvira appears after the séance. Since only Charles can see and hear Elvira, his second wife Ruth does not believe Elvira exists until some bizarre events occur. Elvira makes continued efforts to disrupt Charles' current marriage, which result in unforeseen complications.

Performances will be Thursdays-Sundays, April 11-21, at 7:30 PM (3:00 PM Sundays). Bonnie Whitmire directs. Elizabeth Malzone is Stage Manager. Cast members include Scott Lothrop, Sandra Whitmore, Julie Vorus, Bonnie Carter, Dave Gibbs, Marianne Plunkert and Elly Leidner.
