## Spotlight on Marylou Morrison

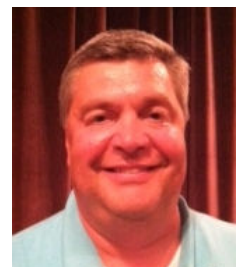

I had directed high school plays in a small Michigan community, so getting involved in Brevard community theatre was an easy transition. Then, almost

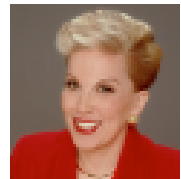
